Core Knowledge: Performing Arts (KS3) and Option Subjects (GCSE)

For Years 7, 8 and 9, this week's core knowledge focus is Performing Arts. For Year 10 and 11, the focus is *a* different option subject from last week. Please spend some time with your child finishing the flash cards they have started in tutor.

Ask them the questions on the front of the cards and see if they know the answers.

If they know the answers, put the cards away and ask them again the next day.

If they don't know the answers, tell them and ask them again until they start to remember them.

Year 9 Immunisations

Immunisations for Year 9 students will be taking place on Thursday 6 March 2025. These immunisations are for Meningitis ACWY and Diptheria, Tetanus and Polio.

- Meningitis ACWY vaccination helps to protect your child against four types of meningococcal bacteria that can cause meningitis (inflammation of the lining of the brain) and septicaemia (blood poisoning). These diseases are very serious and can kill, especially if not diagnosed early.
- The 3 in 1 Teenage booster vaccination protects against Diptheria, Tetanus and Polio. This should be the fifth dose which completes the childhood course; it boosts protection which was started when your child was young.

Advice on using E-Scooters

What is an E-Scooter?



Electrical scooters come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor. E-Scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to E-Scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance.


If you own an E-Scooter you are only able to use this on private land, such as in your garden.

E-Scooters are not to be bought onto the school site at any time.
