Head's up! -Our weekly Headteacher update for families & friends of Stafford Manor

Thank you to the 133 parents and the 283 students who recently completed our parent and student voice surveys to feedback on the things they feel are going well and the things that they would like us to focus on to improve our school.

I am pleased to say that we have had lots of positive feedback and a 3% increase in response rates from parents this year and also an 8% increase in responses from students.

Positive findings from parent voice

The majority of parents feel that their children are happy and feel safe at Stafford Manor. In addition, parents feel that we have high expectations of their children and that their children do well here too. The majority of parents also said that they would recommend Stafford Manor High School to another parent and that they feel we have a good range of subjects available to students. I am also pleased to say that the proportion of parents who feel that when they have raised concerns here, their concerns have been dealt with properly. The majority of parents also said that they feel we ensure students behave well in school.

Positive Findings from Student Voice

Pleasingly, there were many aspects from the feedback we recently received from students that need to be celebrated and shared with you.

The majority of students enjoy attending Stafford Manor High School and that they feel safe. Students were positive about the support they receive in lessons and they feel that teachers give them work that challenges them. This in turn leads to students enjoying their learning. Students feel that behaviour in lessons is good, all or most of the time and that behaviour is also good outside of lessons. Students also felt that behaviour has improved again since last year, which is pleasing.

The majority of students feel that bullying either does not happen, or that if it does the school resolves it. If your child has experienced bullying in any form, please do encourage them to tell a member of staff. If they do not wish to do so, please ask them to let us know via the red hand on the website. Please be reassured that we take issues of bullying very seriously at Stafford Manor and will tolerate this in any form.
