Stafford Manor High School continue to try to support parents/careers with costs within school, however, we have received a letter from our catering contractor informing us that there will be a price increase to school meals. The catering contractor have tried to reduce the costs of food and distribution inflation, but they will have to increase the price they charge us for school meals from £2.83 to £2.95, an increase of 4%.

Unfortunately, we cannot continue to absorb the rising costs of food and this means that from 1 April 2024, the cost of the school meal will rise to £2.95.

It is important no more than ever that if your child qualifies for a free school meal, that you claim for this please.

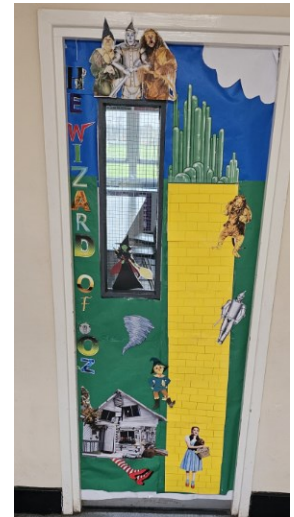
