We will be delivering assemblies and tutor activities to develop our key values and positive behaviours in school. Supporting and developing their character throughout the school day.



Our focus is to catch and recognise students throughout the day, week, half term and term. Communicating more with student and parents on the positive contribution they are having in school and having exciting rewards for students.

At Stafford Manor High School we always aspire to recognise the **positive behaviours** we see **often with the majority of students**.

We will **reward positive choices** and behaviours through achievement points, which can be earnt through showing our values and positive behaviours, in lessons, corridors and in the community.

We also have made some subtle adjustments to the behaviour consequence system and the detention structure to support students in making more positive choices.


One student's entry...
