

Headteacher update 12.10.22

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am delighted to be able to give you the following update on the first half term of this academic year.

A great start to the new term!

We have experienced a very positive start to the new term, and I have been extremely impressed with the warm welcome staff and students have given me. The way they have responded to new ideas and the opportunity to work together to improve systems and the quality of education to the students we serve has been excellent.

We are having lots of positive impact with our students, and this has been reflected in improved attendance and punctuality, improved behaviour and lots of positive comments from students and families about the difference we are making and about how calm and purposeful our school is.

Open Evening Tuesday 27 September

It was wonderful to see so many families attending our Open Evening this year. All members of staff and a wide range of students were involved in hosting Year 6 students and their families. The evening was a tremendous success and we had lots of positive comments from parents.

100% of prospective parents stated that they felt Stafford Manor High School could provide their children with the necessary support and challenge. In addition, 97% of them would recommend the school to a friend.

Developing shared expectations of behaviour

Good behaviour and clear values about how we want students to behave is central to a good education and provides us with the platform from which to create a culture which promotes positive respectful relationships across the school community and a safe, orderly and inclusive learning environment.

Please be reminded of 'The 4Rs' at SMHS on page 2 of this letter. At present we have 90% of students without any behaviour sanctions at all and this shows that the vast majority of our students are meeting our expectations and behaving in a respectful and responsible way that allows a calm, purposeful teaching and learning to take place.

Reminders about uniform standards

As you will be aware, the school uniform guidance is there to ensure that we maintain consistency in the way we present ourselves at school. Wearing the correct uniform symbolises students' readiness to learn and also that they sign up to the culture and ethos of the school. Students are expected to meet the guidelines around uniform, and I would ask that you ensure that your child wears the correct uniform please. Our uniform is affordable, flexible and meets the latest government guidelines. A general reminder about uniform is shown below:

- Hoodies are not allowed to be worn in school and must be taken off before entering the building.
- Students need to wear all black sensible footwear.
- Trousers need to be black matt material, front fastening with a zip,
- Jeans will not be allowed.
- No caps or hats are to be worn in school.

How can students achieve the 4Rs?

I have outlined examples of how students at SMHS can achieve the 4Rs. These will be displayed around school and in tutor rooms to give students helpful reminders about what good behaviours looks like. You may wish to talk about these and remind your child of our expectations.

Use of mobile phones – Important changes to expectations

Like many schools, we have decided to move to a **`no mobile phone school'.** This will begin from when we arrive back from October half term.

We have decided to take this decision to ensure that we can provide more opportunities for face-to-face conversations and better engagement between young people, to reduce instances where students are being distracted and not focused, to promote better mental health through reducing the online information students are exposed to in the day and also to remove opportunities for inappropriate online behaviour during the school day.

That means that our expectations for mobile phone use from Monday 31 October are as follows:

- From Monday 31 October 2022, Stafford Manor High School will be a no mobile phone school.
- This means that students must not have a mobile phone out anywhere on site, under any circumstances, including at social times. Once they enter the school gates, students must turn mobile phones off and keep them out of site please.
- We understand that many parents will want to be able to make contact with their children on the way to and from school. For that reason, it is completely acceptable for students to carry mobile phones we just don't want to see them, at all whilst they are here with us during the school day.

Put simply: If we see a student's mobile phone whilst on site, we will confiscate it and hold this in the main office for students to collect at the end of the day.

If students refuse to hand their mobile phone in, we will use the behaviour sanctions system to apply sanctions for poor student behaviour. A copy of the consequence stages are shown again below.

Behaviour Consequence System

Student attendance

Students attending and being punctual to school and lessons is still a key whole school priority. It will be of little surprise to you as parents to learn that on average, those students who had above 95% attendance achieved at least one GCSE grade higher than their peers in 2022 at Stafford Manor High School. In addition, students who regularly attend school in Years 7-10, make more progress, understand their learning much better and generally have a better quality of education.

Please ensure that you support our whole school drive on attendance and send your child into school each and every day, unless they are extremely ill. If things aren't quite right with your child on a school day, send them in anyway and we will ensure that members of staff are available to support them to continue with their learning.
